Observations

Para superar la materia en la **1ª convocatoria** será necesaria la obtención de un 4 en el examen para que se puedan aplicar los porcentajes obtenidos de las notas de la parte práctica, así como la nota obtenida por la asistencia y participación en clase y, obtener así, la nota final de la asignatura, que evidentemente habrá de ser igual o superior a 5.

En **2ª convocatoria**, el único ítem que será considerado en la evaluación será el examen de carácter teórico-práctico, en el que habrá que obtener una nota igual o superior a 5 para aprobar la asignatura.

La mención de "**Matrícula de Honor**" podrá ser otorgada por el profesor responsable de la asignatura a estudiantes que hayan obtenido la calificación de "Sobresaliente". El número de menciones de "Matrícula de Honor" que se pueden otorgar no podrá exceder del cinco por ciento de los alumnos incluidos en la misma acta oficial, salvo que éste sea inferior a 20, en cuyo caso se podrá conceder una sola "Matrícula de Honor".

Acorde al artículo 9 de la Normativa General de Evaluación y Calificación de las Enseñanzas Oficiales y Títulos Propios de la UCV, el sistema de evaluación continua es el sistema preferente de evaluación en la UCV. El art. 10 permite, no obstante, para aquellos estudiantes que de forma justificada y acreditada manifiesten su **imposibilidad de asistencia presencial** (o a actividades de comunicación síncrona para las modalidades de enseñanza virtual y/o híbrida), su evaluación con carácter extraordinario en la denominada "**evaluación única**". Dicha evaluación única **deberá ser solicitada dentro** del primer mes de cada semestre a Decanato de Facultad a través de los Vicedecanatos o Direcciones de Máster, competiendo a este la decisión expresa sobre la admisión de dicha petición del alumno concernido. Para la asignatura de "Ciencia, Razón y Fe", la prueba a realizar en la evaluación única por el estudiante será un **examen complexivo teórico-práctico** (incluye el doble de preguntas teóricas que el examen ordinario, así como un comentario de texto y resolución de casos prácticos, en los que se deberán aplicar los conocimientos adquiridos en la asignatura). Esta prueba equivale al 100% de la nota de la





asignatura.

CLASS ATTENDANCE IN FACE-TO-FACE DEGREES

In accordance with the development guidelines of the General Regulations for the Evaluation and Qualification of Official Teachings and Own Degrees of the UCV, in face-to-face degrees, class attendance with a minimum of 80% of the sessions of each subject will be required as a requirement. to be evaluated. This means that, if a student does not attend the sessions of each subject, in a percentage greater than 20%, he/she will not be able to be evaluated, neither in the first nor in the second call, unless the person responsible for the subject, with the approval of the person responsible for degree, in view of duly justified exceptional circumstances, exempt from the minimum attendance percentage. The same criterion will be applicable for hybrid or virtual degrees in which teachers must maintain the same percentage in the requirement of "presence" in the different training activities, if any, even if these are carried out in virtual environments.

MENTION OF DISTINCTION:

The mention of "Honors" may be awarded to students who have obtained a grade equal to or greater than 9.0. Their number may not exceed five percent of the students enrolled in a group in the corresponding academic year, unless the number of students enrolled is lower.

Learning activities

The following methodologies will be used so that the students can achieve the learning outcomes of the subject:

- M1 Presentation of contents by the teacher, analysis of competencies, explanation and demonstration of abilities, skills and knowledge in the classroom.
- M2 Specific instructions about group and individual assignments for each topic.
- M3 Group work sessions supervised by the teacher. Study of legal cases, both real and fictitious, analysis, diagnosis, problems, field study, computer room, visits, data search, libraries, network, Internet, etc. Significant construction of knowledge through student interaction and activity. Critical analysis on values and social commitment.
- M4 Application of interdisciplinary knowledge.
- M5 Supervised monographic sessions with shared participation





- M6 Personalized attention and in small groups. Period of instruction and/or orientation carried out by a tutor with the objective of reviewing and discussing the materials and topics presented in the classes, seminars, readings, completion of assignments, etc.
- M7 Set of oral and/or written tests used in the initial, formative or summative evaluation of the student.
- M8 Group preparation of readings, assumptions and problem -olving to present, discuss or deliver in class or tutorial.
- M9 Student's study: Individual reading preparation, case studies, jurisprudence. Writings and papers to be presented or delivered in the classes or tutorials.
