Recommended knowledge

To study the subject of Urban Planning Law, it is recommended to first take those subjects whose content alludes to the General Administrative Law, although it is not an essential requirement to have done it or to have passed the aforementioned subjects.

Prerequisites

Students must have passed at least the 48 ECTS of Basic Training of the first two semesters. Students are free to choose the electives they wish, breaking with the grouping proposed. As explained above, the Study Plan has three optional subjects that are grouped in this way:

- 1 optional subject in the seventh semester.
- 2 optional subjects in the eighth semester.

At the end of the course, the student must be able to prove that he/she has acquired the following learning outcomes:

- R1 Knowledge of the urban legal framework, with special reference to the state and Valencian Community urban legal framework. Sectorial legislation with an impact on the subject.
- R2 The legal status of urban property. The classification and qualification of the land and its relation to the basic situations of the land.
- R3 Urban land regime, both developable and non-developable.
- R4 The urban planning system. Content and approval. Structural and detailed planning.
- R5 Structural and detailed planning, with special emphasis on the differentiation between buildability and use. The use type.
- R6 Land management: programmes for the development of integrated and isolated actions.
- R7 To know the soil management techniques. Reparcelling, expropriation and other techniques.
- R8 To know the planning licences.
- R9 The student will know the sanctioning urban regime and the protection of urban legality.
- R10 The student will be familiar with the transitional regime, with a special emphasis on the consequences of the delay in its processing.

MENTION OF DISTINCTION:

Learning activities

The following methodologies will be used so that the students can achieve the learning outcomes of the subject:

- M1 Group work sessions supervised by the teacher. Study of legal cases, both true and fictitious. Significant construction of knowledge through student interaction and activity. Critical analysis of values and social commitment.
- M8 Exposition of contents by the teacher, analysis of competences, explanation and demonstration of capacities, skills and knowledge in the classroom.
- M9 Supervised monographic sessions with shared participation.
- M11 Personalised attention and in small groups. Period of instruction and/or orientation carried out by a tutor with the aim of reviewing and discussing the materials and topics presented in the classes, seminars, readings, completion of assignments, etc.
- M12 Set of written and/or oral tests used in the initial, formative or summative evaluation of the student.
- M13 Group preparation of readings, essays, resolution of problems, seminars, papers, dossiers, etc., to be presented or delivered in theory classes, practical classes, and/or small group tutorials.
