#### Observations

Note: In order to pass the subject the student must obtain a 50% grade in all items.

**Criteria for granting a "Honor" Mention:** It shall be awarded to the students who have achieved a score equal or higher than 9.0. The number of mentions granted will not exceed 5 % of students enrolled in a subject in the corresponding academic year unless enrollment is under 20, in wich case only one Distinction may be granted. (Royal Decree number 1125/2003)

**To pass this class both in 1st or in 2nd call:** the student must obtain a grade equal or higher that 50% in all items.

In accordance with the regulations governing the assessment and grading of subjects in force at UCV, the distinction of "Matrícula de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) may be awarded to students who have achieved a grade of 9.0 or higher. The number of "Matrículas de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) may not exceed five percent of the students enrolled in the group for the corresponding academic year, unless the number of enrolled students is fewer than 20, in which case a single "Matrícula de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) may be awarded.

Exceptionally, these distinctions may be assigned globally across different groups of the same subject. Nevertheless, the total number of distinctions awarded will be the same as if they were assigned by group, but they may be distributed among all students based on a common criterion, regardless of the group to which they belong. The criteria for awarding "Matrícula de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) will be determined according to the guidelines stipulated by the professor responsible for the course, as detailed in the "Observations" section of the evaluation system in the course guide.
