CRITERIA FOR THE AWARDING OF HONORS:

According to Article 22 of the Regulatory Regulations for the Evaluation and Grading of the UCV, the mention of "Matrícula de Honor" may be awarded by the professor responsible for the subject to students who have obtained the grade of "Outstanding".responsible for the subject to students who have obtained the grade of "Outstanding". Thenumber of "Matrícula de Honor" mentions that may be awarded may not exceed five percent of the students included in theof the students included in the same official transcript, unless this is less than 20, in which case only one "Honorable Mention" may be awarded.only one "Matrícula de Honor" may be awarded.

SINGLE ASSESSMENT: According to Article 10 of the current assessment regulations, in the event that students enrolled in a face-to-face degree programme are unable to attend, they may opt for a 'single assessment'. This is an extraordinary and exceptional assessment system available to

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students who, for justified and accredited reasons, are unable to undergo the continuous assessment system and request it within the first month of each semester, using the means provided for this purpose. It is not a single test but a set of as many tests and/or assessment activities as necessary to demonstrate and measure each and every one of the learning outcomes defined for the subject. These tests may be requested throughout the course and/or, in any case, at the end of the course on the official assessment dates. They may also include the presentation of additional tasks that replace, as far as possible, the educational activities carried out in the classroom and that allow students to acquire the learning outcomes (whether conceptual, such as skills or procedures, or competence-based) established for the subject. In the second sitting, students who have taken the single assessment will have the same conditions as in the first sitting and may choose to retain the grades corresponding to the learning outcomes passed in it by taking or submitting only the assessment tests for the remaining learning outcomes. The Dean of the Faculty, after consulting the course lecturers and the Department management, will decide expressly on the admission of the student's request for a single assessment.

MENTION OF DISTINCTION:

In accordance with the regulations governing the assessment and grading of subjects in force at UCV, the distinction of "Matrícula de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) may be awarded to students who have achieved a grade of 9.0 or higher. The number of "Matrículas de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) may not exceed five percent of the students enrolled in the group for the corresponding academic year, unless the number of enrolled students is fewer than 20, in which case a single "Matrícula de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) may be awarded. Exceptionally, these distinctions may be assigned globally across different groups of the same subject. Nevertheless, the total number of distinctions awarded will be the same as if they were assigned by group, but they may be distributed among all students based on a common criterion, regardless of the group to which they belong. The criteria for awarding "Matrícula de Honor" (Honours with Distinction) will be determined according to the guidelines stipulated by the professor responsible for the course, as detailed in the "Observations" section of the evaluation system in the course guide.
