- 6. To give an adequate answer to the ethical duties related to the profession. To elaborate the corresponding deontological code.





#### Conditions to pass 1st and 2nd enrolments:

#### - For normal participation and attendance:

- ✓ There is no need to pass every teaching practice, but every practical work has to be presented on its proper time following the schedule, whether it is via Platform or for being corrected via normal class.
- ✓ In order to take every assessment tool into account the student must pass the exam —minimal grade: 5 on 10.
- ✓ If the student does not pass the exam, the final grade will be the grade obtained in the exam.

According to the assessment policy of the UCV it is established by article 8 that any student who has a lower subject attendance of the 50% will not be able to take the first exam call. It will be considered as class absence the justified and unjustified ones.

Those students that have informed the professor in advance about their personal situation and it is considered by the professor a justified absence due to working reasons, overlapping subjects, serious illness, second exam calls, etc. will be excluded of this rule and will have the express permission of the professor to take the first call exam. To be excluded from the above mentioned rule it is absolutely indispensable to inform the professor at the beginning

of the semestre and to accept the assessment process that the professor establishes and considers more appropriate for every special case. Under no circumstances the student can appeal these situations to break the rule at the end of the semestre.

Furthermore the professor can establish as absence the repeated delayed attendance, the lack of attention in class as well as the forbidden use of mobile phones, the lack of participation in class, etc. All the previously mentioned reasons can be considered as breaking the rule and therefore taken into account in order not to be allowed to take the first call exam and to penalize the established percentage on class participation and attendance.

The above mentioned rule affects both the assessment percentage on class attendance and class participation as well as the evaluation of class projects and case studies that have their own assessment percentage which are all included and explained in the present course guide.

#### - The student who will not be able to come to class activities:

- The student must do practical activities asked via platform on its due time following the schedule.
- ✓ The student does not need to do the work team research.
- ✓ He will also do the written examination but do not need to participate in any other activity. There are two types of written exam: 1st type: Normal theoretical examination (in the class) and 2nd type: Work-exam (at home). The type of exam will be decided on professor's own reasons.
- In order to take every assessment tool into account the student must pass the exam -minimal grade: 5 on 10. The allocated percentage will be: 50% written exam and 50 % well done practical work.
- ✓ If the student does not pass the exam, the final grade will be the grade obtained in the exam.
