Observations

- 1.- In order to proceed to the sum of the qualifications obtained in the group and individual work, and of attendance and participation, it is necessary to have previously passed the written exam.
- 2.- Criteria for students who prove the inability to attend class regularly for justified reasons: Students who, due to work, health or any other duly accredited circumstance, cannot attend class regularly, should contact the teacher of the subject during the first two weeks of the semester. This will offer an alternative itinerary for the acquisition of the necessary skills to pass the subject.
- 3. **Criteria for the award of Honor Enrollment:** Registrations of honor may be granted to the best students, who must have obtained a note 10. If circumstances require, a special test may be established to determine those deserving students in the honors, given the limitation of 5% of students enrolled.

In second and subsequent calls may only be granted the license plates that could subtract honor after the first call.
